This will be used to establish if they are safe to remain in school during their recovery period. Changes to School Uniform Policy from August 2012

As you will already be aware after receiving letters at the end of June, there are going to be some changes to our Uniform Policy that will take effect from the start of next academic year.

The reasons behind this are that there are an increasing number of pupils who are interpreting the rules in their own way, which is leading to a drop in our standards of dress. The rules will be much clearer and simpler for everyone to follow. There will also be much tougher sanctions in place for those that do not adhere to the rules. We are spending the last few weeks of term educating the students about our expectations, so that parents/carers don't spend money over the summer buying things that will not be acceptable for their child to wear. Please take some time to look through the following information to ensure you are clear about the guidelines. If you are unsure, or would like further clarification, please contact the relevant Year Achievement Co-ordinator for your child.

Brockington College Uniform – Essential Requirements

Trousers

These should be smart **tailored** black trousers **not** jeans. Trousers must be suitable for a working environment - **NO denim, rivets or 'skinny' black fashion trousers, leggings or jeans.**



Skirts

Skirts should be **suitable for a working environment - not too short or tight.** Skirts should be **knee length or longer.**



Shoes

Shoes should be **all black**, small heeled or flat. All shoes should be enclosed and suitable for a working environment. Pupils must **not wear shoes with logos, coloured patterns, laces or stitching.**

A 7I pupil commented:

"I have learnt to show other children and teach them about Fair Trade. We showed the children our quiz and power point. My favourite part was doing the quiz."



Barcelona Art Trip 28 May to 1 June 2012



The Brockington Art Visit to Barcelona took place this year from 28th May until 1st June and, for the first time, our party of 50 Year 8 and 9 pupils and 5 members of staff went by plane! This maximised the time spent there and we were able to cram in lots of amazing experiences.

The first visit was to The Torres vineyard to look at the process of wine making, then to our accommodation in a small chalet village. The following day we visited Port Vell and took a walk up Las Ramblas. We had a picnic lunch at Parc Guell - the idyllic garden retreat built by architect Antoni Gaudi, before going to see his unfinished masterpiece the Sagrada Familia cathedral which was quite awe inspiring. We were treated to a meal at the Hard Rock Cafe as a special surprise in Barcelona that evening. Wednesday saw a trip to F C Barcelona Stadium and Museum, Camp Nou and was a highlight for many. A visit to Joan Miro's museum later allowed pupils to compare the work of different artists and complete some sketching. We also had a brief look at the Olympic Stadium and diving pool, followed by some Latin American dancing in the evening.

Thursday saw a trip to the fantastic Dali Theatre Museum in Figueres, housing many of the Surrealist artist's work. This was followed in the afternoon by sand sculptures and relaxation on Vilanova Beach. Each evening there was an opportunity for activities in the fabulous pool from just swimming to water polo and aqua aerobics!! On our final day we went to the Science Museum, Cosmocaixa, where there is a planetarium, a spectacular tropical rainforest and exhibitions of human nature and evolution of the earth and the

universe. The pupils were treated to a meal at MacDonald's before heading to the airport and home!

Their enthusiasm and behaviour was brilliant at all times and they were a credit to themselves and Brockington College - a wonderful time was had by all!



Maths at Work Maths in the Climate

On Tuesday 26 June 2012 twenty year 8 students went to Loughborough University to take part in a 'Maths at Work - Maths in the Climate' workshop.

The day was part of an awareness project for all students to extend their knowledge in STEM (science technology engineering maths) careers. During the day, pupils completed projects such as Maths in Water with Severn Trent Water - the workshop looked at the value of water in our world today. Maths in Renewable Energy- wind turbine power and Tower Building exercise using Kinex.

Pupils had a better understanding of how maths was used in the real world and the qualifications that could be studied at Loughborough University. Many of our teams learnt the importance of good foundations, either in building, water preservation or education and the diversified opportunities life has to offer. Many students are now thinking of looking at a career involving maths.



BROCKINGTON CURRICULUM



United Kingdom Mathematics Trust.

Each year the Maths department at Brockington College enters all the pupils in the 2 top sets in year 8 for the Junior Mathematical Challenge which is run by the UK Mathematics Trust based at the University of Leeds. There is also an Intermediate and Senior version for older pupils. The JMC is aimed at the most able mathematics pupils in the UK in years 7 and 8.

The JMC encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematics techniques to solve interesting problems. Questions encourage students to think clearly about challenging problems. The questions are multiple choice and to discourage guess work, entrants lose marks for wrong answers in some of the questions.

The challenge took place on 26th April 2012 with over 240,000 pupils taking part from 3770 schools. Certificates are awarded to the highest scoring 40% of candidates nationally (6% Gold, 13% Silver, 21% Bronze). This year pupils therefore had to score 86 or more for Gold, 71 or more for Silver and 59 or more for Bronze out of a possible total of 135 marks.

This year all 65 pupils from Mrs Goddard's and Mr Opara's top sets in year 8 entered the UKMT JMC and we are very pleased that 44 of them gained certificates (68%). This is the highest percentage of certificates we have ever received.

6 Gold, 21 Silver and 17 Bronze.

Nathan Hall received a certificate for best in school scoring 96 out of 135. A score of 110 or more would have qualified him to take part in the Junior Maths Olympiad, he was very close. Well done, Nathan.


Make Your Mark! Play Sport, Create Art

Brockington College have been selected through the reward and recognition programme of the Get Set network, the official London 2012 education programme. They have demonstrated a commitment to living the Olympic and Paralympic Values and incorporating them into their school lives and curriculum.

Guard of Honour for the Opening Ceremony of the Olympic Games


