Dear Parents/Carers and Friends of the College,

Message from the Principal

Parents/carers will have recently received their child's first report of the academic year. As a school, we monitor closely the performance of all our pupils and we are able to say that the progress being made by the vast majority of pupils is excellent, as is their attitude to learning (see page 3). These are critical elements that parents/carers can check for their child in the following ways:

- For each subject, has your child reached or are they close to their sub-target? This is the level that they should have currently attained to be on course to reach their end of Year 9 target. The final target for each pupil is two full levels on from the start of Year 7.
- For each subject, does your child have an attitude to learning grade of 1 or 2? This means that they are working well in the subject.

If you have any concerns in these areas, then I would recommend that you discuss your concerns with your child initially. Pupils receive lots of feedback from their teachers and they should know why they are at their current level and what they need to do to move to the next level. If necessary, you are also very welcome to contact the college to discuss any issue with the relevant subject teacher.

Following recent discussions, Governors have made the decision to consult on a change to 11-16 status. This will take the form of a document that will be made available to parents shortly after the Christmas holiday period. The document will explain the issues to be considered and ask for responses from parents. These responses will then be considered by Governors at the end of the consultation period.

As we approach the Christmas holidays, several members of staff and many pupils have already been very busy with Christmas festivities. Our Christmas Show was extremely well attended and very successful and as you will see on page 10 of the bulletin, we have been involved in a range of Christmas events. I would like to thank all the pupils that have given their time to practice and perform and for the staff that have supported these events. Special thanks to Miss Pilgrim and Mrs Shaw, our brilliant music teachers, who have devoted hours of their time and are an inspiration to the pupils.

At the end of term, several members of staff are leaving for pastures new and I would like to thank them for their service to Brockington College and for the care they have shown towards the pupils. Mrs Jeffrey is retiring from her role within reprographics, Mrs Measures is leaving from her role as a Learning Support Assistant and relocating to Devon, Mr Hutchinson is moving to a promoted position within Science at

a school in Coventry, Miss A Thorpe is transferring from mainstream education to teach English to pupils enrolled at the Leicester Royal Infirmary Hospital School, Mrs Boardman has been offered enhanced hours at Gartree School and Mrs Gray who is working outside of education. Thank you all for your commitment to Brockington College.

School closes at 1.10 pm on Friday 21 December and re-opens for pupils on Tuesday 8 January. In the meantime, I do hope that you all have a very happy and peaceful family Christmas period.

Excellent Attitude to Learning Results

Each year there are three Assessment Points where teachers at Brockington submit formal assessments of the Attitude to Learning (AtL) grade of each pupil that they teach. The first of these Assessment Points occurred recently and parents/carers will have received the information relating to their own child through the assessment data sent home.

Of the Attitude to Learning grades submitted at Assessment Point 1 we are pleased to report the very high level of pupils receiving excellent and/or good grades. The full breakdown of the percentage of grades issued is below.

AtL	Description	% of AtLs
1	Excellent	19.7%
2	Good	75.4%
3	Cause for Concern	4.7%
4	Poor	0.2%

The Attitude to Learning grades have been analysed for trends and to identify pupils who deserve praise or require support to address problems. We also encourage parents/carers to praise their child for positive results and also take time to discuss any '3's or '4's that they have received.

You may also be interested in the following trends that we have identified from the data:

- 20.1% of Y8 and Y9 pupils improved their AtL grades overall
- Only 16 pupils received an AtL4 in one or more subject
- The average Attitude to Learning grade for all pupils was 1.85

Parents who have any queries about individual AtL grades are invited to contact the relevant subject teacher to discuss this with them. Only a limited amount of pupils have received multiple '3' or '4' AtLs – these pupils will receive individual mentoring and support to rectify this problem through their Form Tutor or a member of the Pastoral or Senior Leadership Team.

Overall we are very pleased with the consistently high levels of effort and positive attitude demonstrated by Brockington pupils and congratulate our pupils (and their parents/carers) on their hard work in achieving this.

School Uniform Policy

We are constantly striving to ensure that we maintain our high standards of dress. Thank you to all of those pupils and parents/carers who have supported our uniform rules and are wearing the correct clothing as specified in our uniform policy.

The rules are much clearer and simpler for everyone to follow. There are also much tougher sanctions in place for those that do not adhere to the rules. Brockington College Uniform – Essential Requirements

Trousers

These should be smart **tailored** black trousers **not** jeans.

Trousers must be suitable for a working environment - **NO denim, rivets** or 'skinny' black fashion trousers, **leggings** or **jeans**.



Skirts

Skirts should be **suitable for a working environment - not too short or tight**. Skirts should be **knee length or longer**.



Shoes

Shoes should be **all black**, small heeled or flat. All shoes should be enclosed and suitable for a working environment. Pupils must **not** wear **shoes with logos, coloured patterns, laces or stitching**.



WHAT UNIFORM DOES MY CHILD NEED?

Please ensure that each item is named and that your child leaves home correctly attired in college uniform appropriate for a working environment.

The Governors' policy on college uniform must be followed by all students.

Trousers Black. Suitable for working environment.	Girls	Smart tailored. Not denim, jeans, skinny style, leggings or black fashion trousers. Must not be tight to the legs. Trousers should not have rivets, extra buttons or colour variations.
Skirt Black. Suitable for working environment.	Girls	Not denim. Not tight fitted. Skirts should be knee length or longer.
College Tie	All	Compulsory when not wearing a sweatshirt. Must be tied to the top button (top button only undone) and must hang to cover at least 4 buttons.
Navy College Sweatshirt with badge	All	Compulsory.
Shoes Suitable for working environment. We recommend that canvas shoes/similar are not suitable for college due to danger using equipment in Technology & Science.	All	Shoes should be ALL black, small heeled or flat. Shoes must be totally enclosed. Shoes should not have logos or coloured patterns/laces/stitching.
Hairstyle	All	Hairstyles should be suitable for college.
Make-up Nail Varnish	All	No make-up or nail varnish. It will be removed and, if found, confiscated, with collection by parent/carer required.
Jewellery Limited to one small gold/silver stud per ear lobe and a watch.	All	No hoop earrings, necklaces or rings. No bracelets. No facial or other body piercings, including tongue studs. Jewellery will be removed and confiscated, with collection by parent/carer required.
Summer Uniform Polo Shirt	All	Available as an alternative to shirt/tie/sweatshirt.

Voice it!



As a result of the feedback we received on our 'Anti Bullying' Survey last year, we have launched two new systems designed to make it easier for pupils to log their concerns about Bullying, Anti Social Behaviour or any other concerns about pupils or behaviour in and around the college. The first system is accessed through the school website, where pupils can email the pastoral team (either anonymously or they can provide their name). You can find this by looking at the pupil pages in the 'Care, Guidance and Support' section of the website. The email is checked on a daily basis and then steps are taken to deal with the issues highlighted. The second, similar, system is ran through the 'Voice it' boxes, which are located outside of the Pastoral Office and in the library. Pupils can fill in a form, available in the library, or the front of reception, (some tutors also have forms available in their tutor rooms) and then place it in the box. Again, they can be anonymous or they can give their name.

So far the systems are proving successful. We have found that it has removed the barrier for some pupils, the hardest step can often be telling someone what is wrong, this is much easier to do and much less daunting when it doesn't have to be face to face!

Please keep using the system and keeping us informed. If we are aware we can act, if we don't know about the issue upsetting you then we can't possibly help!



The drawing below is entitled "The Old Method Chart of the Seven Multiplying Squares". It is from the front of Chu Shi-Chieh's book written in AD 1303. While it looks like a Chinese Christmas tree, translated it is actually **Pascal's Triangle** named after Blaise Pascal a famous French Mathematician and Philosopher



To build the triangle, start with "1" at the top, then continue placing numbers below it in a triangular pattern. Each number is just the two numbers above it added together (except for the edges, which are all "1").


Can you build a much bigger Pascal Triangle?
