By the time that you receive this bulletin, all pupils at the college will have received their first assessment grades of the year. Whatever year group that your child is within, it is essential that you take the time to review his or her grades with them. It is important to check that your child is at or very close to their expected grade (Years 7 –9), or is predicted a grade in Year 10 that matches, or is certainly no more than one grade lower than, their target grade. Even more importantly, please check Attitude to Learning Grades (A2L). Are they a 1 or 2 across all subjects and if not, why not?

Despite the technological advancements in the world, children today are no different to their parents, when they attended school. They have their good and bad days; good relationships with some pupils and not so good with others; good relationships with most members of staff and not so good with others, favourite subjects and least favourite subjects. What also remains true is that they do want to be successful at school and in their later life. Our role as parents, carers and teachers is to support them on this journey. Sometimes they need praise, but not all the time, and sometimes they need straight talking, but not all the time. What they do need all the time is encouragement and guidance with their school work and with their growth from childhood to adulthood.

As a member of staff at Brockington, we do not underestimate the role that you have to play in this development. Those of us working in schools for long enough have seen many examples of parental guidance in the right balance leading to happy and successful young adults. The balance between praise and re-direction is an important equilibrium to achieve and one that all parents, carers and members of staff must continue to strive to reach.



## Pupil Safety

It would be a great help to the environment and to child safety, if your child is able to travel to and from school on foot, by cycle or by bus. If this is not possible, we would ask you to consider car sharing and lifts by car on limited occasions.

If you do have to pick up or drop off children, it is essential that you park in the designated areas only and not on the perimeter of the school car park, which obstructs others and creates danger for pupils.

Please also be very careful when driving near to or on the school premises as we all know that children can be very unpredictable.

Please remember that vehicles should only be driven through the barrier to the main college entrance if absolutely necessary.

Drivers should be mindful of the 5 mph speed restriction and proceed with caution, especially just before and after school, to ensure the safety of our pupils as they walk along the driveway. Thank you.



## Brockington College – Cycle Use Rules



Pupils who are issued a permit are required to abide by the following rules:

1. Dismount bike when on the school site (no riding on school property). (3 penalty points).
2. Always have a lock for your bike and use it (for not using your lock). (3 penalty points).
3. Always ensure your bike is in good repair (has working front and rear brakes, fully inflated tyres with tread and reflectors).
4. Only bikes are allowed on site. (No scooters, skateboards, very small stunt bikes, rollerblades, etc).
5. Always follow the Highway Code when travelling to school. This includes:
  - Riding safely and sensibly
  - Stopping at traffic lights, pedestrian crossings and stopping for school crossing patrol officers
  - Not weaving in and out of traffic
  - Not putting pedestrians in danger by riding on crowded pavements
6. Always follow instructions given by school staff regarding bike use on site.
7. Pupils must have their pass available for inspection at all times.
8. Pupils must park in the space allocated (given) to them. **Failure to do so will result in 3 penalty points.**

### Consequences



**Pupils who fail to follow the above rules will receive 3 points each time a rule is not complied with.**

If a pupil receives 12 points in a year their pass will be revoked (withdrawn) and they will get a bike ban.

Each year there will be a fresh start, however if a pupil receives 2 bans they will be ineligible (not allowed) to apply for another permit.



### Cycle Helmets

It is advisable that all pupils who cycle to and from college wear a cycle helmet for safety reasons.

So what skills are employers looking for?



- **Business and customer awareness** – your basic understanding of the key drivers for business success and the importance of providing customer satisfaction and building customer loyalty
- **Problem solving** – analysing facts and circumstances to determine the cause of a problem and identifying and selecting appropriate solutions
- **Communication** – your application of literacy, ability to produce clear, structured written work and oral literacy, including listening and questioning skills
- **Application of numeracy** – manipulation of numbers, general mathematical awareness and its application in practical contexts
- **Application of information technology** – basic IT skills, including familiarity with commonly used programmes.

Congratulations to Ria Mackness (8K) who won first place for her light-themed poem for this year's National Poetry Day last month! Please find Ria's poem below:


*The outcome of light can be great,
