

The NSIF fundraising has led to pioneering work resulting in hope for those suffering life-changing paralysis. The Brockington College Kash4Kenya/South Africa Charity developed by Sarah Heggs is literally helping to keep people alive in the Kenyan villages that we support and to provide vital aid to people in both Kenya and South Africa. Our support over time together for those two charities has already raised nearly £100,000. How amazing is that?

Congratulations to all our Year 10 pupils who undertook their first formal interviews last week. In preparation for 'what is to come', they were individually interviewed by a member of the local business community. Despite obvious nerves, they all performed really well and were praised profusely by the interviewers. Congratulations also to our Year 8 UKMT Maths Challenge team of John Meadows, Madeleine Burnham, Jinay Mehta and Amber Saqladi led by Mr Higham. The team finished third in the County Math's Challenge competition out of 23 teams and were the highest placed state-funded County school - some achievement!

To finish, I would like to thank the staff at Brockington College on your behalf for their tireless work this term. Good luck also to Miss Darby and her team of staff and pupils that are visiting China during the holidays and thank you to Miss Parmar and the Science teachers for facilitating Year 10 Easter revision classes.

Pupil Safety

It would be a great help to the environment and to child safety, if your child is able to travel to and from school on foot, by cycle or by bus. If this is not possible, we would ask you to consider car sharing and lifts by car on limited occasions.

If you do have to pick up or drop off children, it is essential that you park in the designated areas only and not on the perimeter of the school car park, which obstructs others and creates danger for pupils.

Please also be very careful when driving near to or on the school premises as we all know that children can be very unpredictable.

Please remember that vehicles should only be driven through the barrier to the main college entrance if absolutely necessary.

Drivers should be mindful of the 5 mph speed restriction and proceed with caution, especially just before and after school, to ensure the safety of our pupils as they walk along the driveway. Thank you.


In the interests of other pupils with nut allergies, please do not include nuts or nut products in your child's packed lunch. Thank you.



Lunch Loan Vouchers

Should your child forget their lunch or catering top-up, we will endeavour to contact you and request your permission to give them a voucher, if you are unable to 'top up' their account. This voucher must be paid back the next school day. Payment will be automatically taken from your child's catering account as soon as it is 'topped up'.

Lost Property



Items of lost property are taken to the main college reception. Named items can be returned to the rightful owner. Lost property is now displayed outside the main college reception at lunch times, giving pupils a daily chance to reclaim any missing items. Parents/carers who wish to come and view lost property should telephone reception (0116 2863722) to make arrangements to come and do so after college. Due to the volume of lost property, anything remaining after two weeks will be donated to charity.

National Funding Formula for Schools

As you may be aware, the funding that schools receive is different according to the location of the school. Currently schools in Leicestershire including Brockington College are in one of the ten lowest funded counties in the country. We currently receive £500.00 less per pupil per year than the average for secondary pupils across the country. This means that next year, Brockington College will receive £685,000 less in funding than a school elsewhere in the country that is funded at the average amount per pupil. At a time of government cuts to school budgets, this is becoming unsustainable and many schools in Leicestershire already have large deficits.

Because of these historic inequalities, the government has launched a consultation to gauge views on a national fairer funding formula. The second link below explains what the government is consulting upon. The first link is to the actual electronic consultation and we would value your support in completing the consultation to back the move to fairer funding in order to support your child's education. Teaching and Learning/Curriculum Briefing

It is currently a time of great change in education across the UK and in particular at Key Stage 4 where changes to GCSE exam specifications and the new 9-1 grading system are still being finalised. As such, staff at Brockington have been working tirelessly to ensure that the school is ready for these challenges from September 2016. Whilst the English and maths departments are already in the midst of teaching their new specifications, most subjects will be starting substantially modified courses from this September involving changes to the content taught and the format of the examinations themselves.

In order to support each department with their preparation staff have been given access to additional planning time and supported by further training courses in order to complete and resource their long-term plans. As a result, preparations for these new courses are well on schedule, which is a tribute to the hard work, dedication and expertise of the heads of department and their teams.

A letter to parents/carers from the Independent Chair of the local Safeguarding Board



All Leicestershire Schools have become part of a new safeguarding initiative, which aims to improve outcomes for children and families affected by domestic violence and abuse.

This scheme has been designed to provide early reporting to schools of any domestic abuse incidents that might have an impact on a child that attends their school. The approach, known as Operation Encompass is used in a number of other places across the UK and is run in partnership with Leicestershire County Council and Leicestershire Police.


All public agencies currently share information where there are safeguarding concerns or risk of harm to children and the Police currently share information on all incidents of domestic abuse in Leicestershire with Leicestershire County Council.

To further support the welfare of children this information sharing is being extended. During the school term the Designated Safeguarding Lead will now be informed when any domestic abuse incident has been reported to the police and a school pupil was in the household.

This has been introduced because domestic abuse in a household can have a big impact on children, even if they do not see what is happening.

This information will be used to ensure the school is able to provide appropriate support for pupils. The information will remain **confidential** and only shared on a strictly need-to-know basis.
