End of Term Arrangements for Pupils

School will close for the Christmas holidays at 12.30 pm on Wednesday 20 December 2017. The school buses will arrive for this time and will depart at approximately 12.45 pm. Due to the earlier finish, only cold 'grab and go' lunches will be available on this day. Voice It

Voice It was launched after a Brockington Anti-Bullying Survey revealed that students felt that it was not easy to register a concern or report bullying to adults, both at home and school. One reason for this was that they did not feel brave enough to have the conversations face to face and felt it a very daunting idea to have to sit and discuss their worries. Our system can be anonymous or students can leave their names. It makes it easier for pupils to log concerns about bullying, anti-social behaviour and any other concerns they may have in and around the college. The system has proved to be highly effective and is used on a regular basis. Students can use the 'Voice It boxes' outside of the Pastoral Office or in the library, or they can use the online form accessed through the school website. Their concerns are then passed to the relevant Head of Year and Pastoral Manager to deal with and resolve the issues.

- Develop strategies to avoid and resolve conflict
- Explore the implications of sexual maturation and
- Explore the emotional, social and moral implications of early sexual activity

At Key Stage 4, the opportunities discussed at KS3 are developed further and pupils focus on developing three main skills which are:

- The ability to recognise, assess and manage risk in a range of real-life contexts
- Developing an understanding of relationships and sexuality and the responsibility of healthy relationships and
- Developing an understanding of the roles and responsibilities of parenting



Thirty students from Year 8 went to London on a Parliament trip on Thursday 14 December. They saw live debates in action in both the House of Lords and the House of Commons and strolled past a busy looking John Prescott whilst taking a tour of the buildings. The group picture in front of the Christmas tree depicts the students enjoying the festive feel of the Grand Palace.

After the tour, unfortunately cut short due to traffic and a late arrival, the students were escorted to the Education Centre where they took part in the People's Parliament Workshop. Here, pupils considered the power of the people to affect change in a democracy. They experienced historic events from Parliament's past in the immersive 360° projection space and saw how popular protest has led to change. After meeting suffragettes in the Ladies' Gallery of the House of Commons, pupils planned their own campaign and justified their choice of action, presenting their ideas and evaluating the effectiveness of different protest methods.



Our staff and the Education Service staff were impressed with how well students listened and responded in the quiz. They did Brockington proud and may grow to be political forces to be reckoned with.



Visit to Oxford University

'Christmas Lectures' at Oxford

On Tuesday 12 December, fourteen lucky Year 9 students attended the famous 'Christmas Lectures' based in the Natural History Museum at Oxford University in the company of Mr Higham and Mrs Johal. This event enabled pupils to see Maths and Science in action and the experience of attending such a profound University.



The first talk by Fiona Jones from Oxford University was looking at the behavioural traits of specific breeds of penguin in the Antarctica. During her study she has visited this area and neighbouring regions of South Georgia. Her research has been collaborated with other research faculties around the world with an intention of preserving these species. The findings of her two visits were shared and enjoyed by all of the students.

The second talk was by Holly Reeve, a researcher from the Chemistry Department who spoke about the influence nature has had on the designs of planes, trains and modern digital equipment such as phones. The progression of technological advancements and the impact the natural world has had was discussed and shared with the group. The interactive question and answer sessions were enjoyed by all of the audience.

An excellent day was had by all students who thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity of visiting this University and experiencing the research prospects that both science and mathematics hold.

This term in the Design Department, we have had Leicestershire County Council support a small group of students to get involved in making a sustainable bag.


