The 2014 Amendment of the Human Medicines Regulations now allows schools to keep a Salbutamol inhaler for use in emergencies. The use of this inhaler is restricted to those who:

- have written consent from a parent/carer
- have been diagnosed with asthma
- have already been prescribed an inhaler.

Brockington College has a Salbutamol inhaler available for use in such an emergency. We therefore require your consent, if your child has been diagnosed with asthma, for us to administer this should the need arise.

Please also note that it is also extremely important that your child:

- has a prescribed inhaler which is clearly labelled with them at all times
- does not share their inhaler with others
- if required, has an identifiable spare inhaler stored in the medical room ('Administration of Medicines' forms are available for this on the school website).
