Define the terms "Low Income Countries" (LICs), Newly Industrialised Countries (NIC) and High Income Countries (HIC) and explain how we can classify these countries into similar groups		
What are the global processes that connect countries at different levels of development including the UK?		
Define the term "Globalisation" and explain the factors that lead to an ever connected world, including the concept of technology, trade, TNC's, migration and cultural exchanges.		
Describe how the UK is connected to other countries by the process of globalisation		
What are the causes and consequences of uneven development?		
Describe how globalisation can lead to inequalities in world development at a global and national scale		
Explain the consequences of globalisation on uneven development in the UK and One other LIC country		
Analyse the social, cultural, political and economic consequences of globalisation on societies including the UK and one other LIC Country in detail.
