Dear Parent/Carer

Re: School Uniform Drive

We had a great start to the New Year with all pupils looking smart and following our uniform policy. However, over recent weeks, standards have started to slip and we are seeing an increasing number of students wearing incorrect uniform, jewellery and false nails. In order to maintain our high standards of dress, we will be having a uniform drive, which will start on Monday 25 March 2019 and continue for the remainder of this term.

We will be focussing on three key aspects of uniform:

- **All pupils wearing a school polo shirt.**
- **All pupils wearing correct school trousers or skirt (no leggings, chinos or jeans).**
- **All pupils wearing permitted items of jewellery and make-up (a watch, a small stud in each ear and a small nose stud (Year 9 pupils and above) and no false nails).**

As part of the uniform drive, we will be contacting home to alert you if your child is wearing incorrect uniform and to ask for your support in rectifying this as soon as possible. Page two of this letter contains a summary of the school uniform policy for your reference. Pupils will be asked to remove any jewellery that is not permitted immediately and this will be kept securely for parents/carers to collect from school reception. False nails will need to be removed or filed down and the colour removed by the following day.

Pupils will be informed of the uniform drive through form time and assemblies.

| Black fully or partially pleated skirt to the knee or a minimum of 18 inches in length | Girls | Compulsory. Suitable for school. <u>MUST NOT</u> be tight fitting or stretch/jersey material. | |
| Footwear Suitable for school. We recommend that canvas shoes/similar are not suitable. | All | <u>MUST</u> be <u>ALL</u> black, small heeled or flat. <u>MUST NOT</u> have any colouring on shoes/laces/stitching. <u>NO BOOTS</u> | |
| Hairstyle | All | Hairstyles should be suitable for school and avoid extremes of colour and style. | |
| Make-up | All | Year 7 and Year 8: No make-up or nail varnish or false nails. Year 9 and above: Natural toned foundation/concealer and light mascara <u>ONLY</u> . No nail varnish or false nails. | |
