

### Voice It

Voice It was launched after a Brockington anti-bullying survey revealed that students felt that it was not easy to register a concern or report bullying to adults, both at home and school. One reason for this was that they did not feel brave enough to have the conversations face-to-face and felt it a very daunting idea to have to sit and discuss their worries. Our system can be anonymous or students can leave their name. It makes it easier for students to log concerns about bullying, anti-social behaviour and any other concerns they may have, in and around the school. The system has proved to be highly effective and is used on a regular basis. Students can use the 'Voice It boxes' outside of the pastoral office room 018 or in the library, or they can use the online form accessed through the school website. Their concerns are then passed to the relevant head of year and pastoral manager to deal with and resolve the issues. The boys asked questions throughout their tour and gained relevant information about future career opportunities.

We were again lucky to have an insight into the construction and offices on site and a chance to ask how females were accepted into construction trades at present. Students asked questions regarding the various trades and positions within the company and their salaries.

Both visits were enlightening and students enjoyed the opportunity to see an ongoing construction site and gain knowledge from both companies involved.

# Performing Arts

There is a wide range of instrumental tuition available at Brockington College, which is provided by a variety of expert private instrumental teachers. In most cases, your child will need to have their own instrument and bring it into school for lessons (with the obvious exception of drum kit and piano.) This means students are able to receive their instrumental lessons during the school day but all communication regarding the arrangements and payments are made directly between parents/carers and the instrumental/vocal teacher.

Lesson times are on a rota, so while students have lessons on the same day each week, the lessons are at a different time to avoid missing the same lessons regularly. # E-safety

## Do you know who your child is chatting to online?



Teens need to know that they can't assume everyone online is who they say they are. They should always report any inappropriate material or conversations immediately to their parents/carers and to the social networking site. We understand children can be very curious when it comes to the online world, but we can't stress enough how important it is that they are aware of risks when chatting to strangers online.

It is incredibly important for children to understand that they should NEVER give any personal information to anyone online, even if the person claims they know them. This includes giving out personal information to people they really do know in real life. Make sure they are aware that when they are chatting with a friend they actually know, there could be other people observing the chat that they do not know. We regularly tell students to never type any personal information online, especially when using chat sites, and to be sceptical of anyone they connect with online.
