### **End of term and start of term notices**

#### **Easter service – Friday 8 April**

#### **Non-uniform day – Friday 8 April**

#### **Living with Covid-19 - updated guidance from 1 April 2022**

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the next steps for living with COVID-19 in England from Friday 1 April.

The guidance states:

- *Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.*
- *If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.*

We are no longer able to issue Covid-19 tests for use at home. Please continue to help to reduce the spread of Covid-19 at Brockington College by following these guidelines. 


## Expectations – summer term 2022
