Dear Parents/Carers and Students

Re: Start of autumn term 2022-23 – arrangements and expectations

I hope that everyone has managed to have a restful period at some point over the summer holidays and an enjoyable time together as a family. As no doubt your thoughts are starting to turn towards returning to school, I wanted to write and highlight key information and expectations.

Start of the day

Students should assemble for 8.30am in designated areas, as detailed below. Staff will be on hand on Tuesday 30 August to direct new year 7 students to the correct assembly point.

Car park

Over the summer we have been busy refurbishing and redecorating a number of areas across the school. We have also carried out work to increase capacity and safety within the car park.

Additional parking spaces and a new layout have been marked out for the safety of all. Please ensure that you drive carefully, park considerately and follow the new layout. As always, where possible we would encourage you to drop off and collect your child away from the school site, but please park considerately and avoid blocking driveways and entrances for those who live in close proximity to the school.

Lockers

Locker payments have been added to year 7 ParentPay accounts. Please can parents and carers of year 7 students make payment via ParentPay before Friday 2 September. Lockers will be allocated to all students during the first week of term. Any student eligible for opportunities funding through the Pupil Premium will receive a locker; if payment has been made before information has been received by the school then the cost will be reimbursed.

Break and lunch

Year 7 students will be given their ID cards during their first few days in school; existing students should ensure that they bring their card with them when they return to school. Replacement cards can be purchased via ParentPay. Please ensure that your child's catering account is topped up, from home via ParentPay, in advance of them buying food. It is essential that students bring their card to school with them every day in order to buy food at break and lunch times. The Astro turf will be available during some lunchtimes for access to play football only. In order to access and take part in a game, students will require shin pads and suitable footwear.

Pastoral support

You child's form tutor should be your first point of contact for all enquiries and you will be informed of their individual email address. The work of our tutors is overseen by the heads of year and

We believe in working in a close partnership with parents/carers that involves trust and shared expectations. We encourage students to take responsibility for their actions, make the right choice, and recognise that, at times, we all make mistakes. College uniform

As members of staff at the college, we do not wish to waste any learning time through discussions with students about non-school uniform items. However, we will insist that uniform standards are high and will require all students to adhere to the school uniform policy as highlighted on the college website. Thank you for your support with this. Please note: leggings are **not** part of the school uniform and, therefore, must not be worn.

Mobile phones

Students may bring a mobile phone to school, but this is at their own risk. Students must ensure that mobile phones remain in lockers throughout the school day. If a mobile phone is seen during school hours, it will be confiscated and parents/carers will have to collect it from the school office.

Equipment

The following items are the minimum required for daily use. Indeed, students will be required to have specialist equipment for certain subjects, particularly in years 9, 10 and 11.

- pencil case
- pens
- pencils
- ruler
- rubber
- coloured pencils
- scientific calculator (model sold in school – CASIO fx-85GTX)
- glue stick
- maths set (protractor, compasses)
- set of unbranded ear buds for use with computers/keyboards.
