

## **SIAMS Inspection 15-16 June**

On 15-16 June we have our SIAMS Inspection. All Church of England and Methodist schools are inspected approximately every five years by a SIAMS inspector from the Church of England, although there has been some delay to our inspections due to Covid.



This inspection looks at our Christian vision and values and our effectiveness as a Church School. The inspector's name is Allyson Taylor, and we look forward to welcoming her to our school over the two days. Once the report is written it will be published, and the inspection findings will be shared with you. This will be approximately three weeks after the inspection. The report will celebrate all that is special about the school and will identify next steps that are helpful in the school's ongoing development as a Church school.



## School Show 20-22 June

We are really looking forward to our school show, The Wizard of Oz, which is taking place Tuesday –Thursday 20-22 June. The show is always a highlight of the year, and I am grateful for the hard work of all the students and staff involved. Tickets cost £3.50 and can be bought through ParentPay. The show starts at 7pm each night and is expected to last approx. 90 minutes.





### Year 11 Final Assembly and Prom 22-23 June

Our Year 11s have been superb throughout their exam season which is set to finish in the next week. We are so proud of how they have prepared for their final exams and how they have conducted themselves throughout. On 22 June at 9am the Year 11s will have their final assembly with us. As well as shirts and pens for signing, students may want to bring tissues with them for what will be, I'm sure, an emotional final assembly with us. (Please can students also return their locker keys on this day). Year 11s finish their time with us with their Prom that is taking place on the evening of 23 June at the King Power Stadium.

For those Year 10 Students who have opted to take part they will be completing their work experience across this week. All other Year 10 students will be in school as normal. For our current Year 9 students, we will be providing all the information about this in the autumn term.

## **Parent Information Evening 27 June**

On Tuesday 27 June at 6pm we are holding a Parent Information Evening. You may remember at the start of the year we held individual 'The Year Ahead' evenings for each year group, which we will be doing again in the autumn term. This information evening builds on that evening and aims to give parents an overview of developments that have taken place throughout the year, and future plans. Throughout this year, following our OfSTED inspection last year, we have continued in our efforts to build better communication with parents. This has included launching a monthly newsletter, starting a Friends of Brockington Group to proactively involve parents in the life of the school, and holding ongoing Parent Focus Groups which have really helped us gather feedback from parents and helped us formulate what more we could do differently. We have appreciated all the support our parents have given us in helping to move this forward. Already, in response to the feedback, we have continued to adapt the newsletter to provide parents with relevant information. We have continued to work on our social media strategy and have also employed a part-time marketing coordinator who has just started work with us. We are working with our middle leaders to consider how we can make the curriculum more accessible to parents so that you can proactively support at home, as many of you desire to do.

The evening will outline some more of this work. It will also provide updates across a range of areas, including building work we are having done over the summer. In addition, our Trust Leader, Sharon Mullins, and the Trust Director for Education, Laura McWhinnie will also be presenting on the ways in which the Trust supports all its schools and how it works with Brockington specifically.

## Friends of Brockington AGM 29 June

For those who are already involved in this, you will know that our Annual General Meeting for FOB is due to take place on 29 June at 6.30pm. However, we are seeking more volunteers to become involved with the Friends of Brockington. The aim of the group is two-fold. Firstly, to organise a series of events throughout the school year that families and friends might attend, such as quiz night, and summer and Christmas Fayres. Secondly, to consider how we can support our community. Ideas we have considered so far are the setting up of a clothes bank, charity events that might be put on and how we might support those in need in the community. # **Year Group Awards Evenings 3-6 July**

A new addition to our calendar of events is our Year Group Awards Evenings. Throughout this year we have increased the ways in which student successes (in their very many forms) can be celebrated. At the start of the year, we invited parents and carers to attend the Young Leaders' Awards evening where we were joined by the Bishop of Leicester and Loughborough as we celebrated students in Years 8-10 who had achieved this award through the demonstration of real leadership.
